Annual Spring Event

Mother Daughter Event held in March to commemorate the International Women's Day with the goals of:

- A. Reaching more youth to gain a better understanding of how to meet their needs and foster a good relationship at home
- B. Building relationships to foster better academic achievements and social skills with the girls
- C. For OGAV to be effective we need to start where it is most important, that is home. Statistically, it has been proven that girls succeed and thrive when they have good support at home.

Citizen Girls - Youth in Action

A project focused on building political leadership in young Canadian and Nigerian marginalized women through. This project is funded by Alumni engagement Innovative Fund (AEIF) US Department of State.



OGAV was invited by AEIF alumni team that is being sponsored by AEIF 2020 of U.S. government-sponsored international exchange programs to support public service projects to collaborate with them along with other partners the Jean Augustine Centre for Young Women's Empowerment and Carisma4U Educational Foundation in Nigeria.

International Project – Care Pack Initiative

The project purpose is to distribute care packages of personal, hygiene products (reusable sanitary pads), dry food products and health and wellness workshop to 1000 girls of Agege public secondary schools. A low income area of Lagos State, Nigeria. This helps address the impacts of COVID - 19 on youth who have faced increase challenges to obtain hygiene maintenance products and barriers to mental health support as a result of the pandemic. A Resource booklet - Blooming in Adversity - was put together to support the program.



Blooming in Adversity – Virtual Weekly Meetings

A weekly virtual program was set up to encourage teenagers to be more interactive to alleviate stress for good mental health and well being through a virtual program. It is a virtual location that is open to all girls in primary/middle and secondary schools. In the sessions, usually mentors (known as facilitators) guide the participants through a selected topic of the week in the form of discussion, presentation, and occasionally games or pop quizzes. At the end of the session, there is a lucky draw

for the participants presents.



The social connection the girls are able to achieve virtually on Zoom is very important to their well being, both mentally and in their overall wellness and it helps build capacity. This is of the utmost importance now more than ever as there are no longer many after school co-curricular activities to engage them. Providing this platform for them where we have different professionals speak on relevant topics and they have the opportunity to hang out with other girls is essential to their mental health and welfare

OGAV became a registered member of Volunteer MBC. This afforded us the opportunity to access volunteers in peel region that supports our events.

This year has been difficult to raise funds due to the pandemic lock down but turned out to be a very positive year through the support of our initiatives.


